We have a new committee to supervise The Ten Most Wanted List. Edgar Dewel brought the idea to us and he is the chair of the committee. Please read his report on how this idea will help Clayton Library.

Many of you have been awaiting a status report on our invitation to the National Genealogical Society to have their 1994 annual meeting in Houston. This invitation was made as the result of a unanimous decision of the CLF Board and was sent along with letters of welcome and support from Governor Bill Clements, Frank Lively (editor of Texas Highways), Mayor Kathy Whitmire, Councilman Vince Ryan, Jane Ellen Cable of the Harris County Heritage Society and many others. Also included were letters of support from David Henington, Director of the Houston Public Library and Maxine Alcorn of the Clayton Library.

Sharron Ashton, Regional Councilor of NGS made an on-site inspection tour during the period January 21-23.

We have a copy of Sharron's seven page report to the NGS Council dated January 24, 1990. It is very complimentary concerning Houston, the Clayton Library and the CLF capabilities. Your CLF committee has been hard at work in anticipation of a "showcase event" for Clayton Library and the local genealogical community.

The 1994 conference date cannot be announced until the 1993 date and place is announced but we will keep you informed of our progress.

What's In The Library

We have all read wills in which land was willed to sons (as a rule), found records of land on which taxes were paid and deeds made in transfers of property. Genealogists delight to find a deed in which a parent transfers a tract and names the children. Everyone who does family research knows that wills, taxes and deeds mean a Court record. Unless a fire (Sherman, of course) destroyed the records they are available in the county, or Archives, of each state.

Frank Stamper, an attorney, was considered the authority in Texas for Texas land titles. His book "A Handbook for Texas Abstractors and Title Men" was a gift to me by Mr. Stamper's widow, Bess Stamper. The book has been donated to Clayton Library (Gen 976 S783). I am a firm believer in the value of land grants, patents, titles and plats to prove family connections when all else fails. If you have Texas ancestry, don't overlook this help in tracing your lineage. GOOD HUNTING.


