What's in the Library: Information is sometimes hidden away in unlikely places. If you have any Confederate soldiers in your family, check this book located at the end of the West Virginia section with the periodicals. The title is SAINTS AND HORSE THIEVES - A Family History Study and Report by Damon A. Veach. There are three volumes bound as one, and the call number is shown as PER.

In Vol. 3, No. 4, pages 114-117, there is a reprint of an article from the Daily Richmond Examiner for Tuesday morning June 3, 1862. It is a list entitled "The Wounded of Recent Battles." There are approximately 180 names of men with regiment and company names. the list contains names from VA, AL, NC, MS, GA, FL, TN and SC. The article states that there are 600 other men in area hospitals not included in this list. Perhaps the next edition of the paper would show these names.
