SPECIAL NOTICE

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGE-

t the November 25 CLF board meeting, on a motion made by CLF Director Robert de Berardinis, a proposed by-law change was unanimously adopted to specifically protect the CLF Endowment Fund, now totaling over \$118,000, from any future board's ability to invade the principal of the fund by a vote of a simple majority. The CLF board is in the process of creating a trust for the endowment fund to provide another layer of protection.

RESOLUTION

Whereas the endowment fund was set up with the expectation of the donors that only the income from the principal be used by the board, there is no formal restriction in place to prevent the invasion of the corpus of the CLF Endowment Fund.

Thus, be it resolved to amend the by laws of Clayton Library Friends to include a new section to read:

Section 7.10 The officers and directors shall not invade the corpus of the CLF Endowment Fund. The officers and directors may only disburse, if they elect to do so, the income from those funds listed as "The CLF Endowment Fund." The officers and directors are under no obligation to spend the income. The officers and directors may elect to have a professional manager to invest the funds of The CLF Endowment Fund. The officers and directors shall oversee the management of The CLF Endowment Fund. The treasurer shall maintain the records of The CLF Endowment Fund and shall make periodic reports of the fund's status to the officers and directors and the membership.

Pour more collections of Revolutionary War era microfilm from the U.S. National Archives are in at Clayton Library as well as another fifteen rolls of M 246, Revolutionary War Muster Rolls. - 2. M 881, Compiled Service Records of Soldiers Who Served in the American Army During the Revolutionary War, 1,096 rolls (\$37,264 at current NARA pricing).
- 3. M 1004, Central Treasury Records of the Continental and Confederation Governments Relating to Foreign Affairs, 3 rolls (\$102 at current NARA pricing).
- 4. M 1014, Central Treasury Records of the Continental and Confederation Governments, 23 rolls (\$782 rolls at current NARA pricing).

To go along with Clayton's resources concerning the Revolutionary War, Clayton Library Friends was able to find and purchase the 11 volume definitive Spanish guide to documents in all the Spanish government archives, Documentos relativos a la independencia de Norteamérica existentes en archivos españoles (Madrid: Ministerio de Asuntos Exteriores, Dirección General de Relaciones Culturales, 1976–85). These volumes give precise citations for photocopy retrieval from the respective archives in Spain.



WHAT'S New ?

Santa Claus was good to Clayton Library Friends because the microfilm collection of the Panton, Lesley & Co. papers is now at Clayton. This collection consists of the account books and other records of the company for settlers/traders in early Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, and the Florida parishes of Louisiana, from 1765 to 1810 or so.

For those wishing to use this collection, Clayton has two collection guides on the shelf that should be consulted first, *The Papers of Panton, Leslie and Co.* [Guide to the Microfilm Collection], 970.1 P198 USA. Furthermore, Houston's Trevia Beverly has a book on the shelf concerning this collection, *Frontier Traders in the Southeastern United States: Panton, Leslie and Company and John Forbes and Company*, 975 B571 USA.

Also, there are two books available on Inter Library Loan that researchers will want to consult. The first is by William Coker, the historian at the University of West Florida who assembled and calendared the papers. Coker's interest was both professional, as an historian, and personal, as a genealogist — Coker was also a descendant of the Spanish and British settlers of West Florida. West Florida in this context is the area bounded between the Mississippi and Apalachicola Rivers, up to the latitude of Natchez, Mississippi. These are:

- 2. Leora M.Sutton, Success Beyond Expectations: Panton

Leslie Co. at Pensacola (Pensacola, Fla.: p.p., 1991).

EARLY GEORGIA RECORDS

Thanks to CLF member Joan Evans, Clayton Library now possesses the entire probate records collections for both Richmond and Columbia Counties in Georgia up to 1830. This represents over 40 rolls of film and has complete will indexes up to the 1960s. This film is available now on the second floor at Clayton.

EARLY ALABAMA RECORDS

To complement the purchase of microfilm of the Panton, Lesley and Co. and "The Cuban Papers," for early Alabama, Clayton Library Friends purchased the only surviving records of colonial Mobile. They were found in the cupola of the courthouse during its renovation in 1998-1999. Included with the documents are indexes. The documents are in French, English, and Spanish. Additionally, through a donation by the Fort Virginia Point Chapter # 2539, UDC, CLF purchased the Alabama Land Office's Alabama Land Grants and Patents. 1819–50. The Mobile records are:

LOUISIANA RECORDS IN ENGLISH

CLF Manager Marje Harris in 2002 asked CLF Acquisitions Director Robert de Berardinis to start identifying all colonial manuscript records consisting of deeds, censuses, ship lists, and militia rolls in various state, academic, and national archives concerning Texas, the Gulf Coast, the Mississippi Valley, and Thirteen Colonies. Additionally, Ms. Harris asked him to locate finding aids and translated indexes or guides.

Along with the Cuban Papers, two of the most important archival collections for the Gulf Coast and Mississippi Valley from 1700–1804 are the French Superior Council Records and Spanish Judicial Records of the Cabildo, both housed at the Louisiana State Museum in the Old Mint building in New Orleans.

Last year The Clayton Library obtained permission to buy photocopies of the English language summaries to the Spanish Judicial Records of the Cabildo, 1763–1804 (not yet shelved). Now The Clayton Library has the name indexes to both French Superior Council Records and the Spanish Judicial Records. This is microfilm of the eard index.

Additionally, CLF purchased the English language summaries to the French Superior Council Records (on microfilm) done by the WPA in the 1930s. These coupled with the donated edition of Marion McCarley, S.C., comp., Robert de Berardinis, gen. ed., French Superior Council Records of Louisiana: 17171763, An Index to Abstracts in The Louisiana Historical Quarterly M478 LA, will allow French- and Spanish-challenged researchers wide access

to these manuscript collections.

CLF has also purchased the roll of Library of Congress microfilm that contains the following items:

(Continue from Roll 4)-French, Spanish, and American management of Louisiana, 1800–37, and undated; Value of Louisiana (report), 1763; Florida y Luisiana, 1780 (Transcripts of 28 documents, 14931780); Letters of Charles Trudeau (Royal Surveyor General for the Spanish Province of Luisiana), 1777-1815; Charles Trudeau's Surveyor's notebook, 1795-1797; Louisiana Records, Vol. 1, Vital statistics from family Bibles and other sources; Louisiana Records, Vol. 2, Vital statistics from tombstones in cemeteries; Index to Louisiana Records, vols. 1 & 2; and Papers in relation to the purchase of Louisiana, 1803–4.

Trudeau's Survey book covers the entire province—Missouri, Iowa, Arkansas, Louisiana, Florida, and parts of Mississippi and Alabama. This, The Papers of Sebastien Vincente Pintado (Pintado was Trudeau's assistant and later Surveyor General for the Spanish Province of West Florida), and the not-filmed, next to impossible to see Pintado survey plats (in Special Collections at LSU) represent in many instances the only identification of people in land records during the Spanish Colonial Period.

To complement the above purchase, CLF also purchased the six roll set of *The Papers of Sebastien Vincente Pintado* from the Library of Congress. The rolls contain the following:

Roll 1, General Correspondence, 1785–1802; Roll 2, General Correspondence, 1803–05; Roll 3, General Correspondence, 1806–29; Roll 4, Official Papers (Deeds, Land Grants, etc.), 1781–1808; Roll 5, Official Papers (Deeds, Land Grants, etc.), 1809–1842; and Roll 6, Maps and Plats, 1793–1830.
