President's Message



We are starting 2022 with hope for a more normal year. Clayton Library is currently open five days a week for six hours a day. But we still face the need to follow Covid precautions that impact the operation of both Clayton Library and Clayton Library Friends. Please plan a visit if you haven't been to Clayton since the pandemic. The staff is delighted to see you and support your research whether you are just beginning or are a veteran.

Both negative and positive impacts have resulted from these health and safety precautions for Clayton Library Friends. Those of us who have enjoyed volunteering at the library and in the Clayton House are missing the interactions with library patrons and staff since Houston Public Library has not re-opened volunteer programs as of this date. We hope that will happen later this year. In addition, we are still unable to schedule in-person meetings because the library's meeting rooms have not been opened to the public yet. We miss gathering with you, but our "forced" move to virtual programming has increased participation from both our members and a much broader audience from out-of-town and out-of-state. Be sure to join us via Zoom twice a month for Genealogy Face2Face and at our quarterly meetings.

The library's required changes during the pandemic have not changed Clayton Library Friends' commitment to make sure Clayton maintains its preeminent status in the genealogy library world. Throughout the last two years our Acquisitions Committee has continued to add hundreds of desired books to the Clayton collection, and our Angel Program has continued to subscribe to the many periodicals that our members and the library staff request. On 16 March 2020 the Houston Public Library closed the doors at all locations. As the pandemic moved on its path, the Houston Public Library (HPL) needed to develop ways to provide service to all our customers, the regular library users and of course, the family history researchers.

Offering quality presentations to help further research knowledge is a major hallmark of the services we provide at Clayton. Prior to the pandemic, we were just beginning to figure out how to add online programming. The pandemic presented a major opportunity. Since the closure of the library, many of you have attended our Friday "Clayton Library Presents." We hope those of you that have joined us enjoy the presentations, and we invite everyone to join us. The Clayton Library Friends stepped in also, taking the reins to develop Face2Face online, a get-together hour that offered and continues to offer comradery, presentations, ideas, and often laughs. Our meeting rooms remain closed; our volunteers have not been re-engaged. The organization remains under City of Houston COVID-19 protocols regarding in-person programming. The library volunteer services department is being revamped, and like all of our volunteers, we wait impatiently for the opening of these opportunities again.

CLF Donated-Duplicate Book Sale –

Books that are donated to Clayton Library, that the library already owns or does not need, are listed for sale on our Clayton Library Friends website – claytonlibraryfriends.org These books are usually priced at \$5 - \$10 - \$15 per volume, although an occasional volume may be priced higher.

There are four lists: 1) books dealing with a single state – listed by state, 2) books dealing with Texas, and 3) a group of multiple lists – foreign, general, U.S., and Civil War. List #4 contains the new items that were added to lists 1 thru 3 in the current update. So, if you looked at the lists last time it was updated, you can see what new titles have been added without going through everything again. The lists are updated every 4-6 weeks or after adding 100 or more new titles.

Many of these sale books may be purchased from the Book Sale shelves in the main library building.
